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# Get Started

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## STEP 1: RESTART YOUR COMPUTER (refresh your RAM)

Restart your computer at the start and during any work session (several times) because your computer will slow down gradually when you use big programs like Premiere Pro. It means your RAM is running low (Random Access Memory). RAM refreshes when you restart your computer.



## FOLLOW THE FIRST SETUP STEPS BELOW (even if you know Premiere Pro)

You could lose your project or a lot of time if it's not set up properly. Please follow the steps below until we get to "Choose Your Path" section, where you can choose "Advanced" to take off on your own or "Beginner" to complete your project step-by-step.

## WORKSPACE OVERVIEW:

Below is your workspace. Change the size of any panel by clicking and dragging.

### Effects Controls

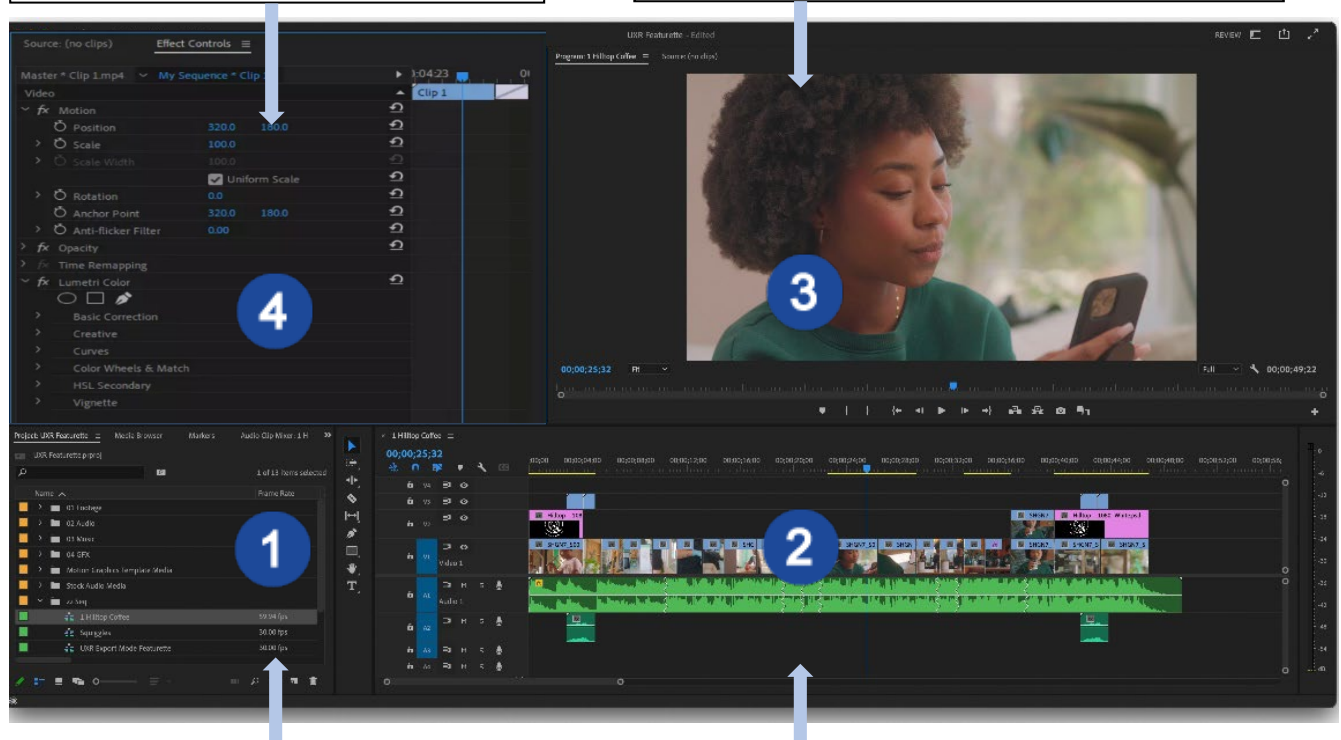
Optional way to input properties numerically (such as scale, position, opacity, rotation, etc.)

### Source Panel

Pre-edit clips you want to use before dragging them to the timeline, or add effects

### Program Panel

Play video that's currently on your timeline.



### Project Panel

(includes Media Browser)

Import your videos, photos, etc., here (drag/drop) and perform many other tasks.

### Timeline Panel

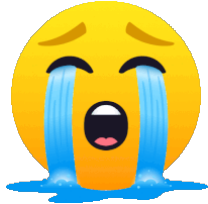
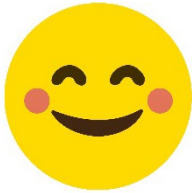
Drag video clips here from the project panel. First, start a new sequence (Ctrl/Command-N)

# Organize Your Files

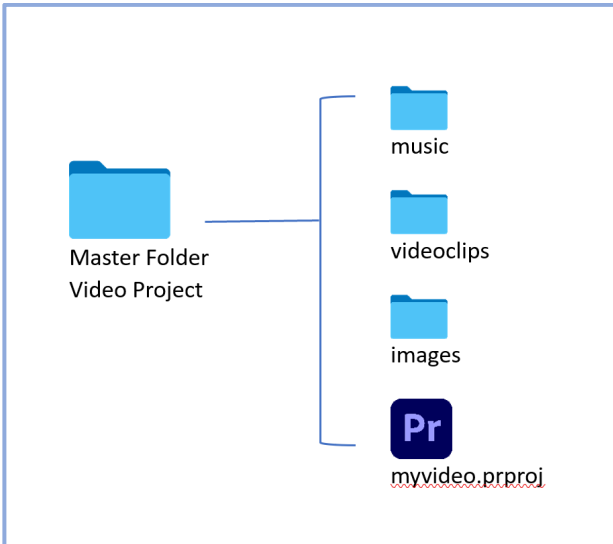
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## ■ ORGANIZED FILES vs. LOST FILES

You'll risk losing your whole project easily if your files are not properly organized. So this is the most important step you will take in your project.



## ■ CLASS PROJECT (simple organization)

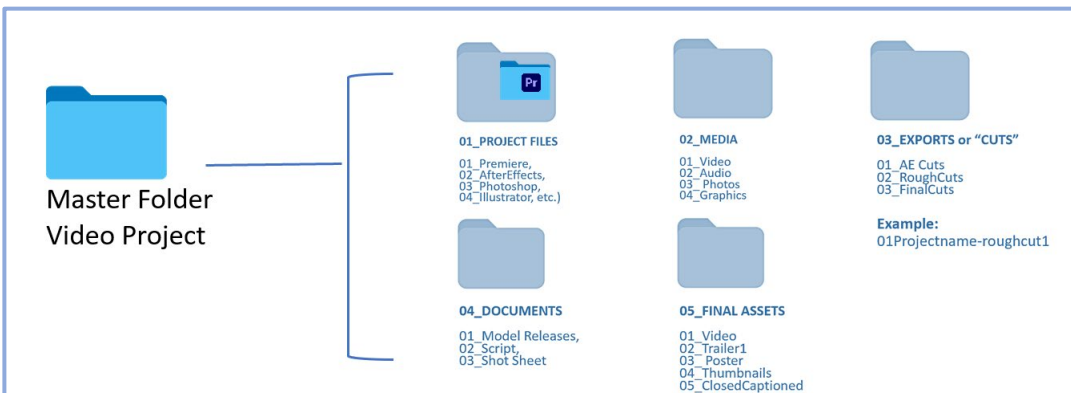


1. Create a **master folder** on your desktop.
2. Inside that folder, create individual folders for your music, videoclips, and images (name them whatever you choose).
3. **Never rename or move** these folders after they're created.
4. If you want to move or copy your project (e.g., to back it up), move **the whole master folder with all the files inside**.
5. When you want to open your project to work on it, **open the project file from inside your master folder, NOT from inside Premiere Pro**.

WHY? Because students can get confused when Premiere Pro shows them images of the most recent files it detects—these may or may not be your real files. Your files do not exist inside Premiere Pro—they are on your laptop (backed up to the cloud server you choose).

## ■ PRO PROJECT (example of elaborate file organization)

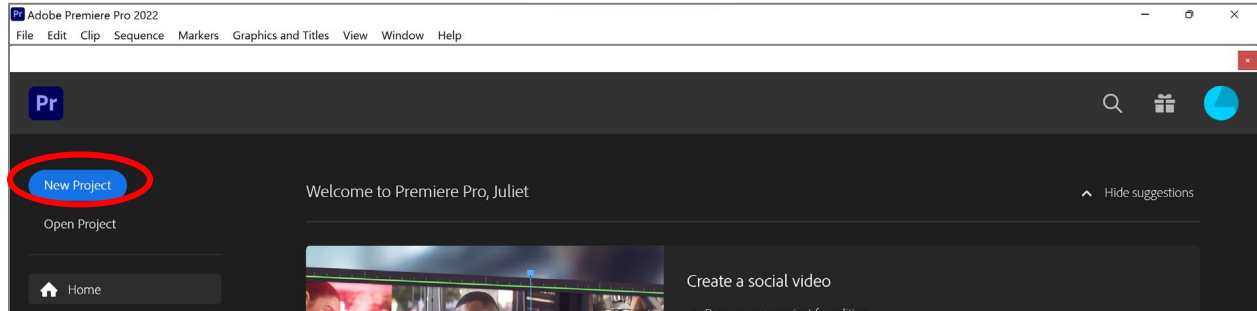
You don't need to do this now, but keep in mind pros use different file naming conventions for elaborate projects.



# Create a New Project in Premiere

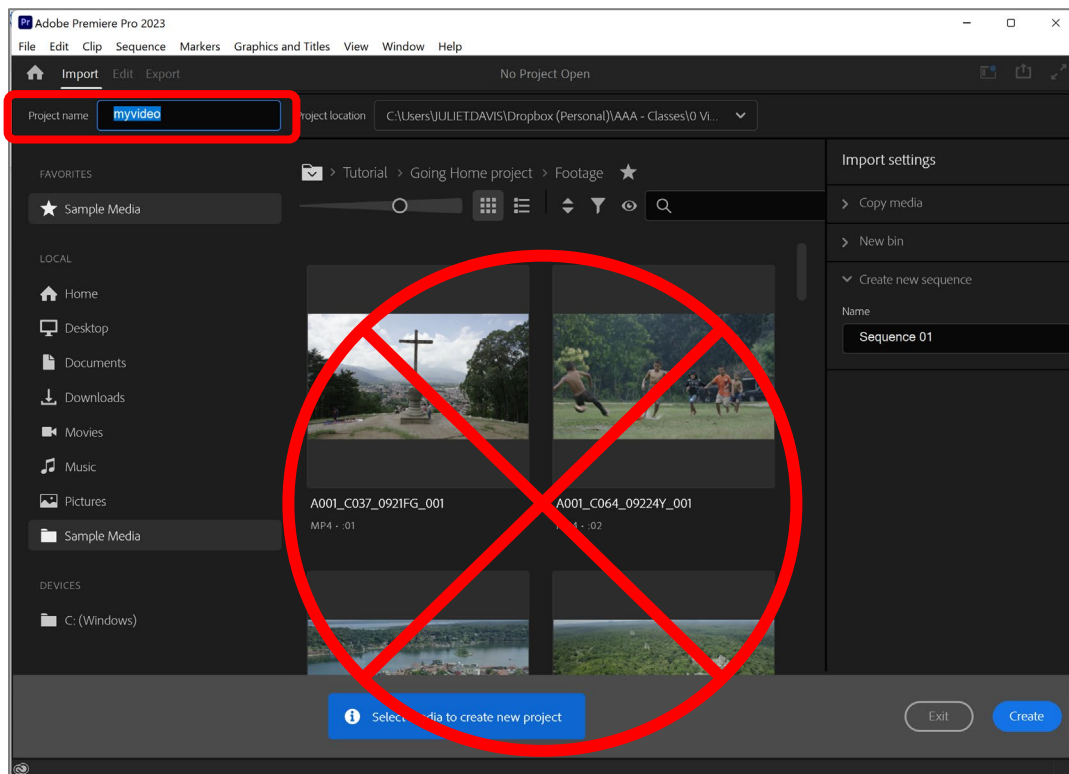
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**OPEN PREMIERE.** Click “New Project” button.



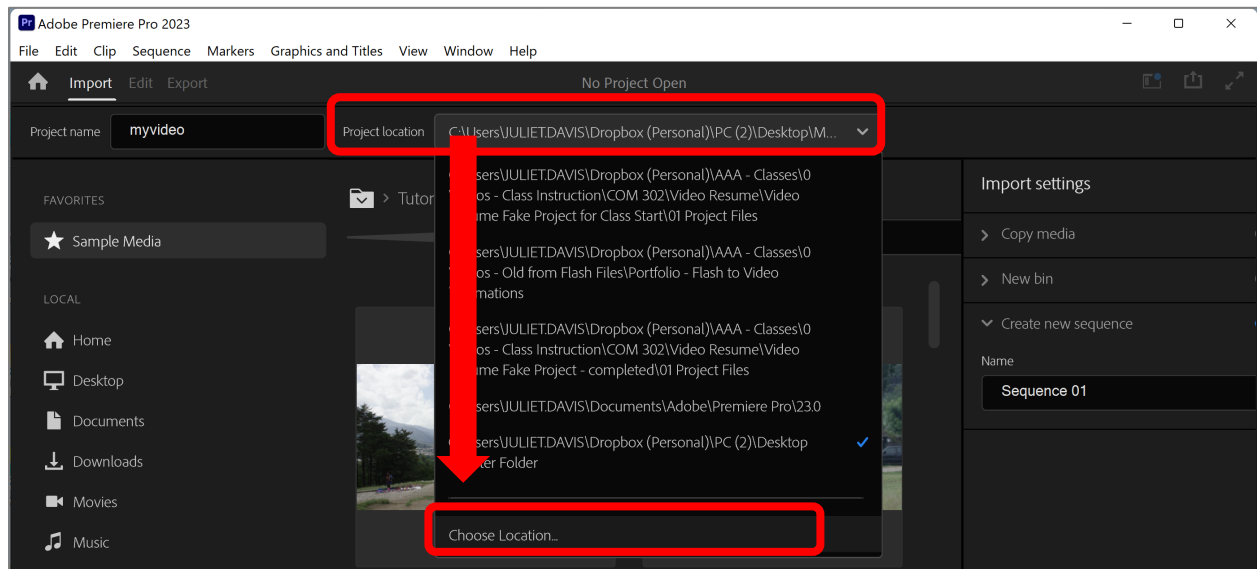
## NAME YOUR PROJECT

1. In the new screen, ignore all images Adobe is trying to sell you (or hook you on).
2. In the top left “Project Name” area, name your video (this will be the name of your saved file).

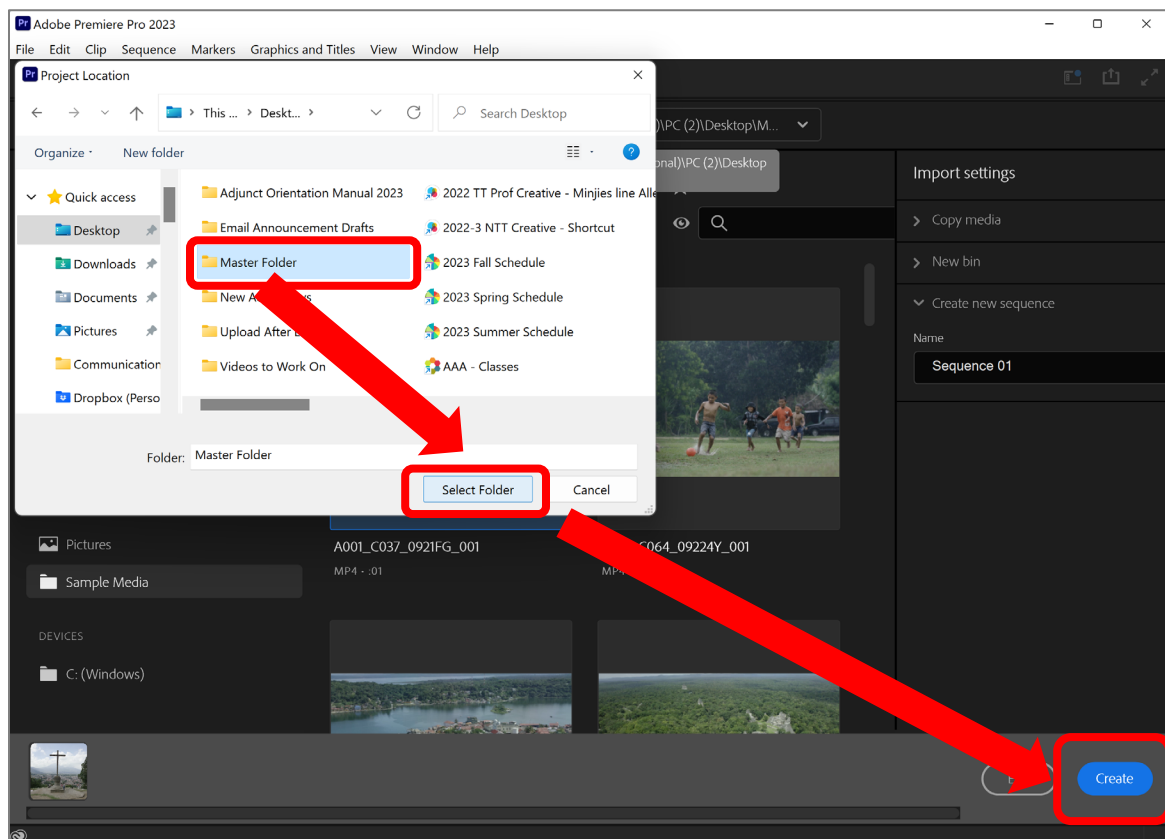


## ■ CONNECT TO YOUR MASTER FOLDER

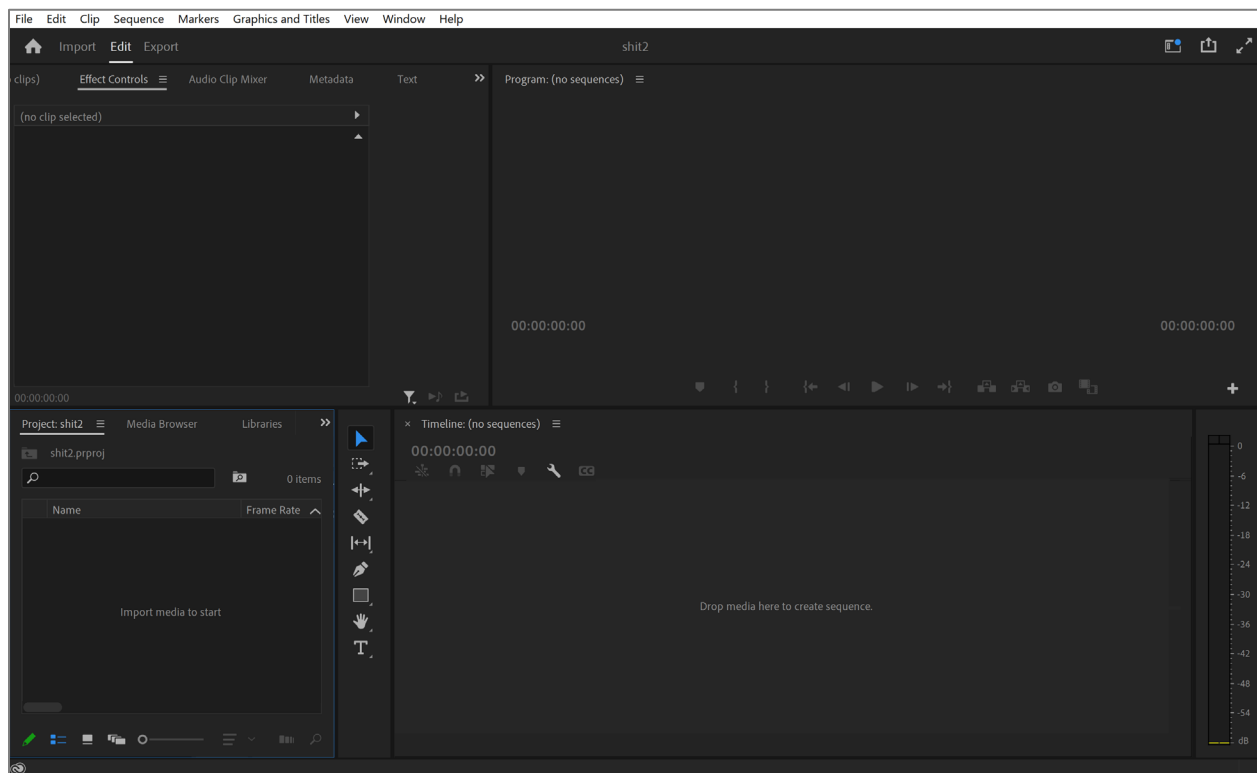
1. Click on “Project Location” (upper center).
2. Click “Choose Location.”



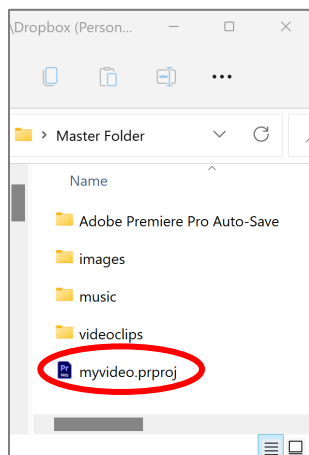
3. Browse to your MASTER FOLDER, select it, and click “Select Folder,” then “Create.”



4. You will see your full workspace open for a new project.



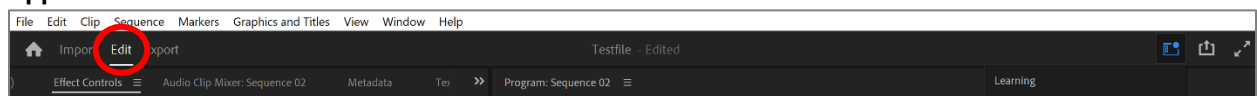
5. **Check your master folder on your desktop.** Open your master folder on your desktop to make sure it now *contains your .prproj file inside*, along with the folders you created. If it is not inside your master folder, start over from the top of these instructions.



## SET "EDIT" WORKSPACE

In Premiere, make sure you are in the "Edit" Workspace.

### Upper Left

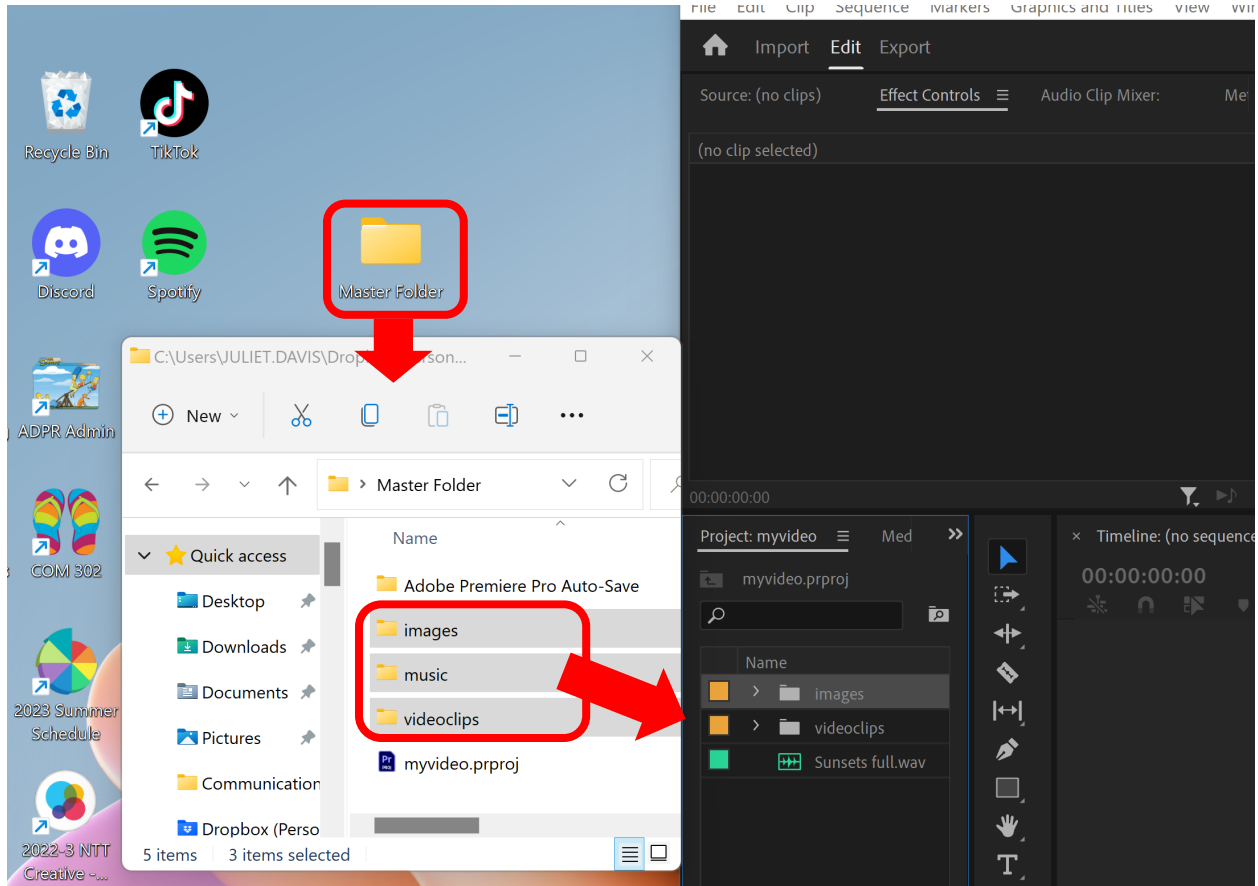


# Import Media

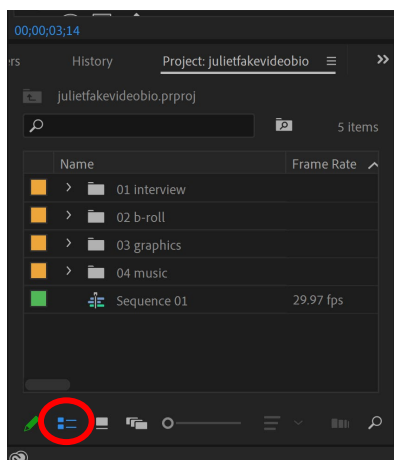
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## DRAG AND DROP FOLDERS

1. Open your MASTER FOLDER on your desktop to reveal the inside folders.
2. Drag and drop those inside folders (video, music, image, etc.) into the Project Panel in Premiere.



3. Click the “List View” icon at the bottom of the panel to see files easily.

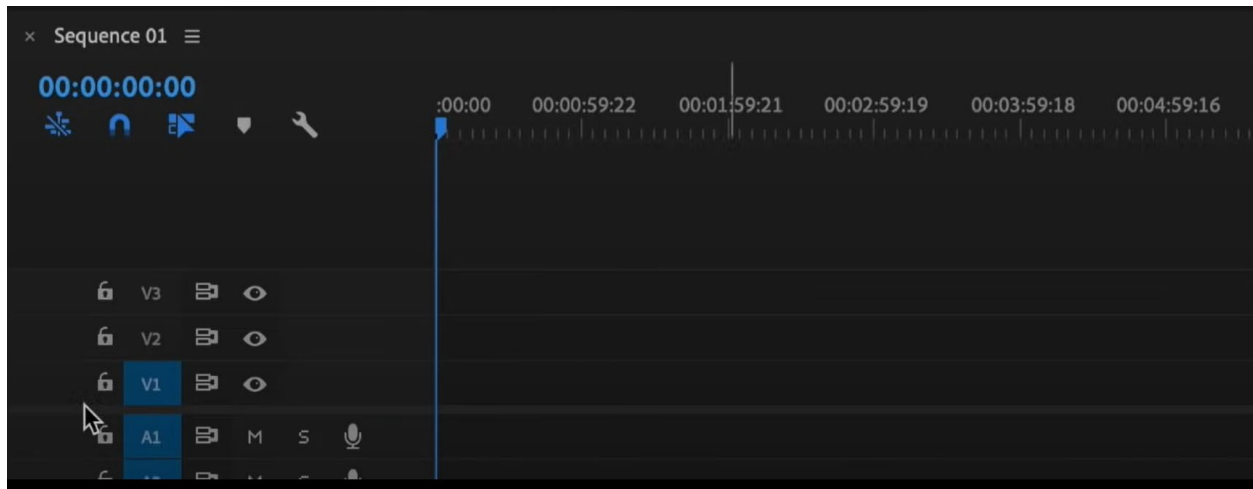


NOTE: Folders with just one file will show the file and not the folder (weird, I know).

# Create a New Timeline Sequence

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A sequence is the space where you build your video on a timeline. It includes your screen dimensions and other important specifications.



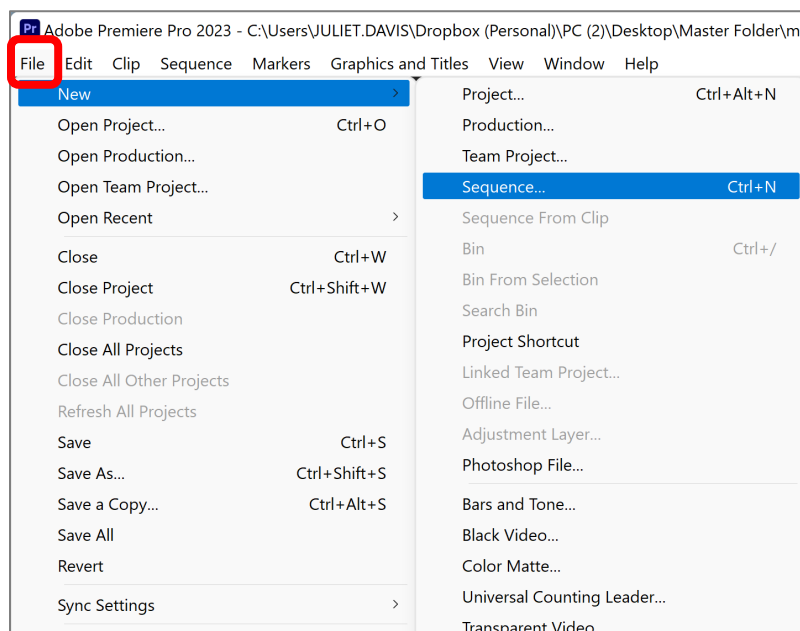
**STOP.** This isn't the point yet to take off and experiment. Follow the steps below carefully below to set up your first sequence so you don't get your project in trouble from the get-go.

## **DON'T DO THIS**

Don't drag a video to your timeline area to start your sequence. While this works, it will cause your screen size to be created in whatever size the clip is that you dragged over. So, your whole video could be too small or too big.

## **DO THIS INSTEAD: CREATE A SEQUENCE**

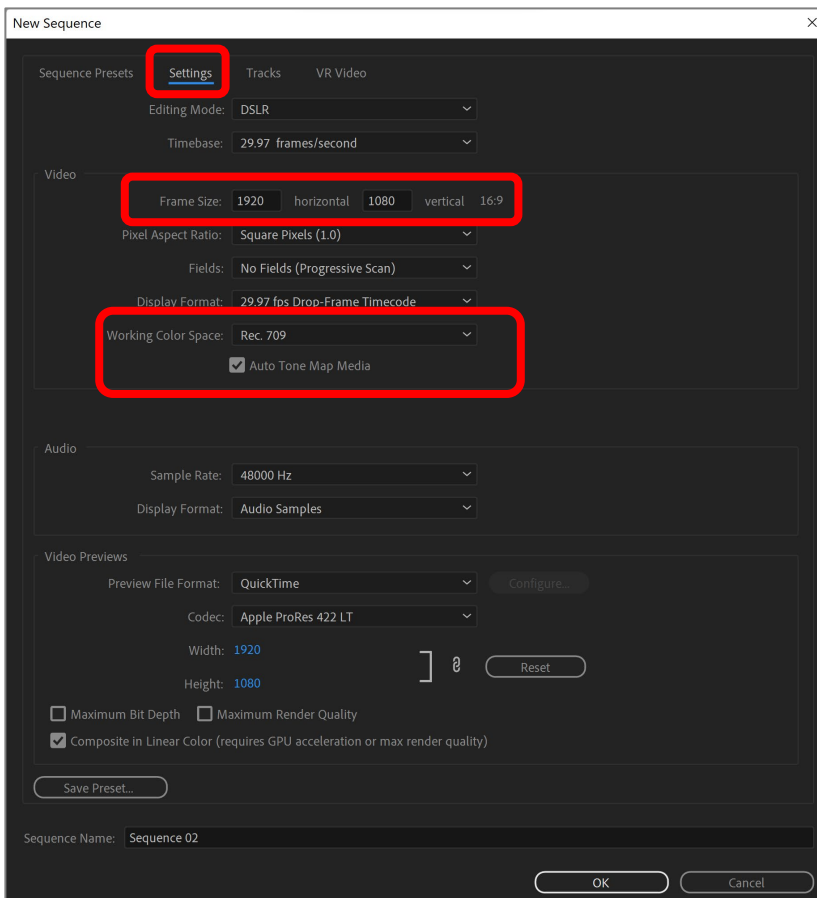
Go to **File > New > Sequence** OR use shortcut **Command/Ctrl+N**





## ■ SEQUENCE SETTINGS (your video dimensions)

In the new window, click on “Settings” and enter the info in the side bar below. Enter the screen dimensions below OR see [Sprout Social for Social media dimensions](#) you might want.

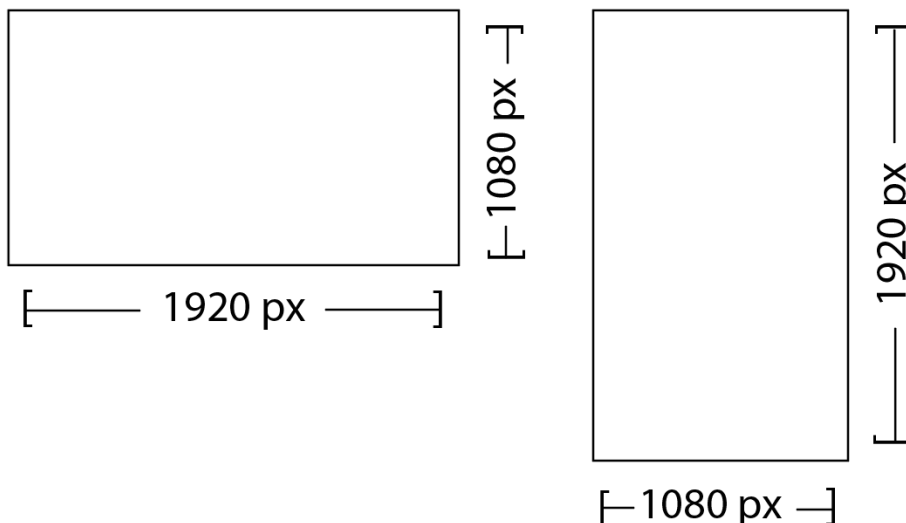

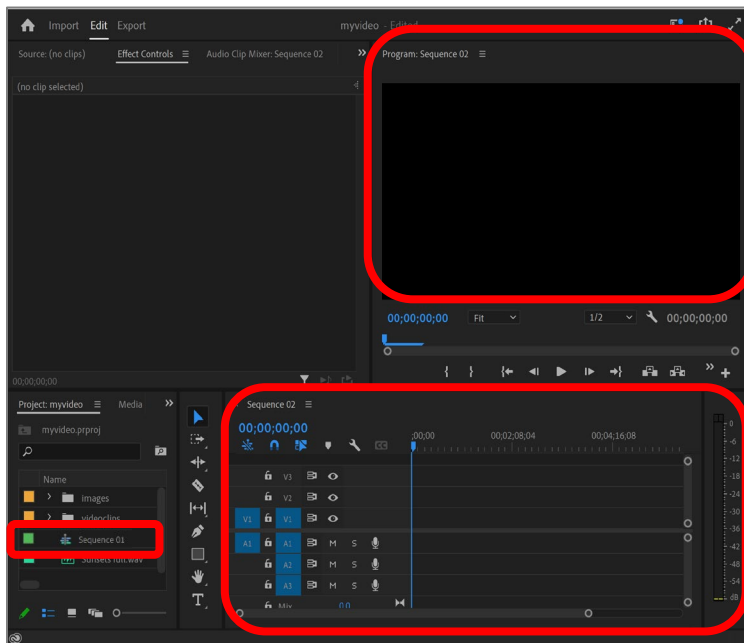

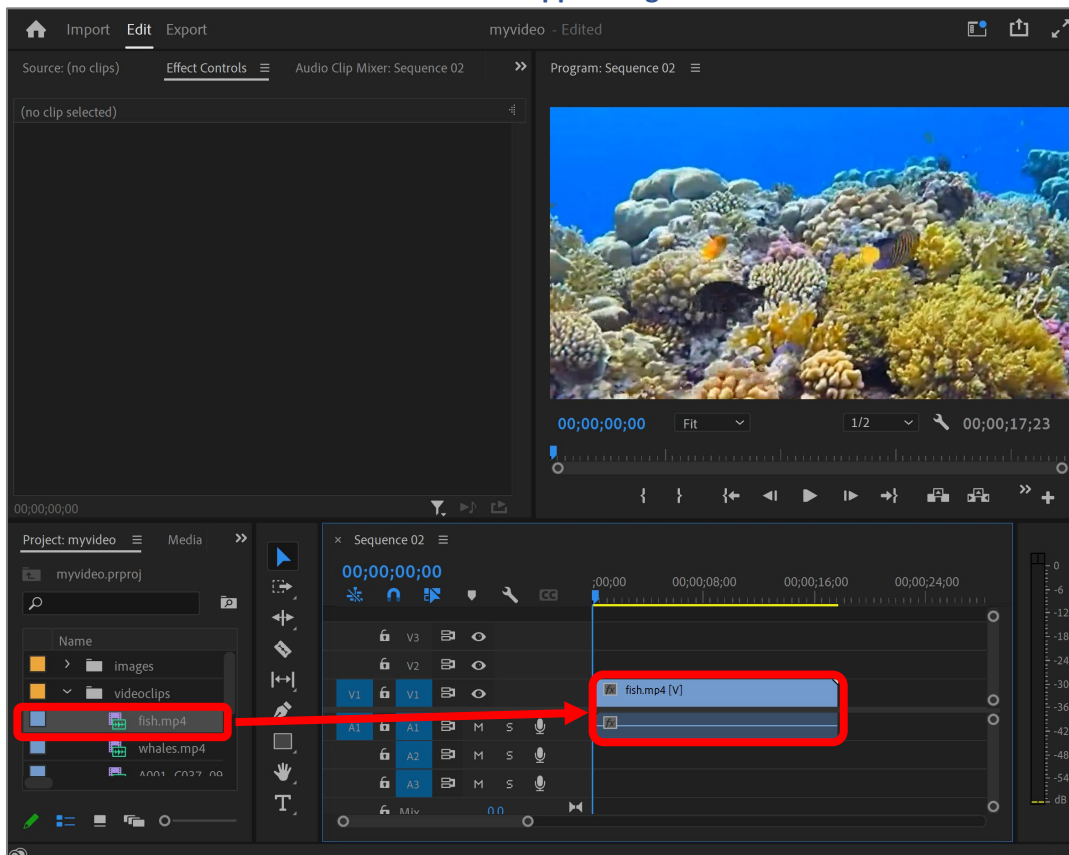
You will see your new sequence, including:

- a new **timeline** (this is where most of your work will be done)
- a **video screen area** (black rectangle, upper right)
- a new **file called Sequence 01** in your project panel (lower left).

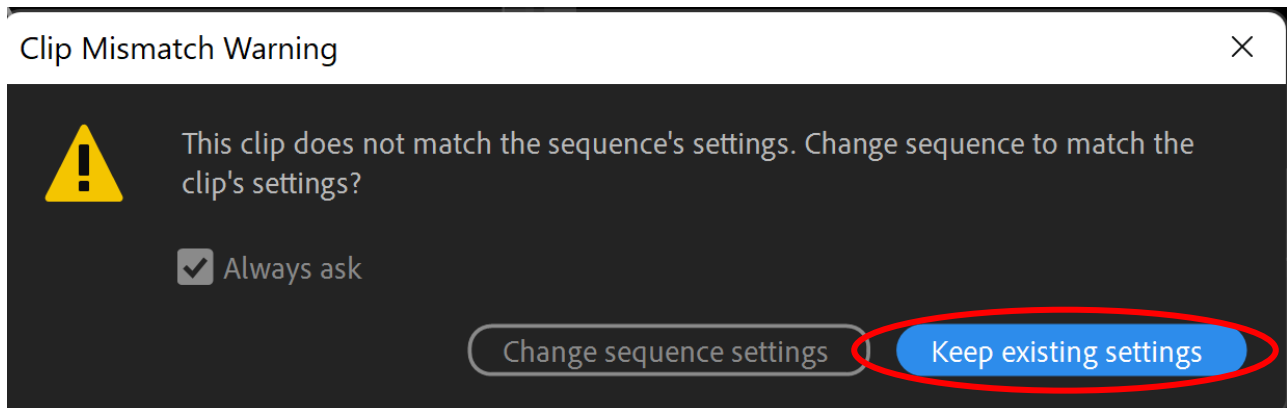


## **DRAG A VIDEO CLIP TO THE TIMELINE**

1. Now you can **drag and drop** a video from your **videoclips** folder to your **timeline** on **the v1 track**.
2. You will see the **video and audio tracks appear together** in the timeline.



3. If you receive a warning that your clip does not match the sequence you created, click **“Keep existing settings”** to retain the dimensions of the video you’re creating (see below).



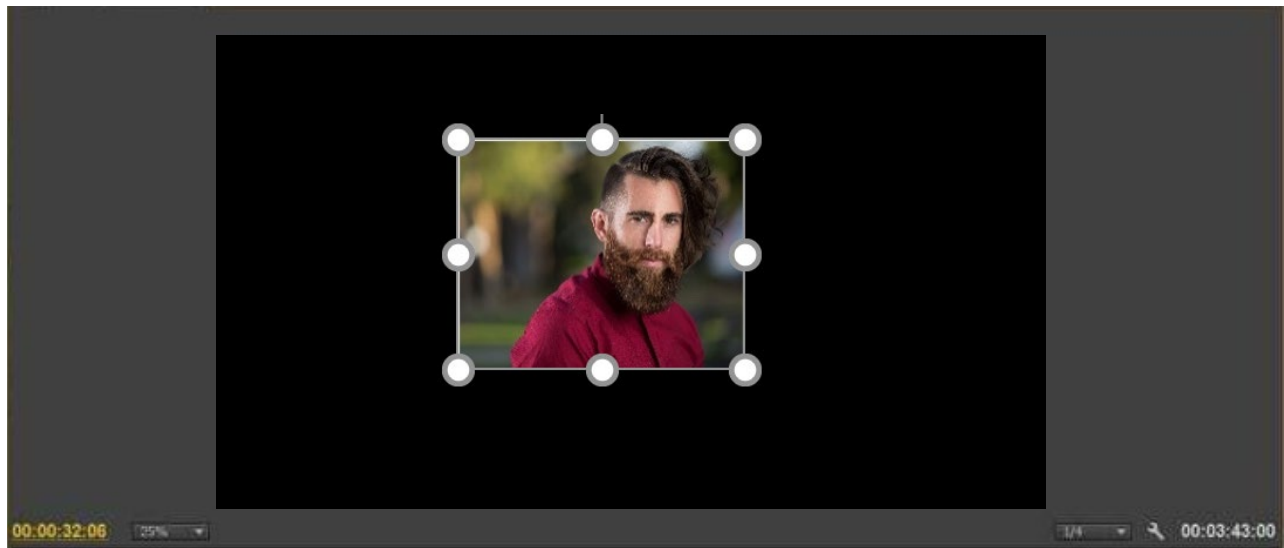
## ■ IF YOUR CLIP APPEARS A DIFFERENT SIZE THAN YOUR VIDEO SCREEN

If your clip appears to be a different size than your video screen in the program panel:

**Double-click the clip and drag it larger or smaller** (or use the options below).

This is also how you can create the effect of a closer shot (closeup, etc.)

*NOTE: If you stretch your video too much, it could pixelate.*



**OPTION 1:** **double-click the image of the video** and drag it to larger or smaller dimensions as needed.

**OPTION 2:** right-click on the clip on the timeline and select **“Scale to Frame Size.”**

**OPTION 3:** In the **Effects Control Panel** (upper left), change scale of the clip (instead of 100%, type a new number).

**OPTION 4:** Change your video screen to match your clip instead, if you want to (Sequence > Settings)

# Effect Controls

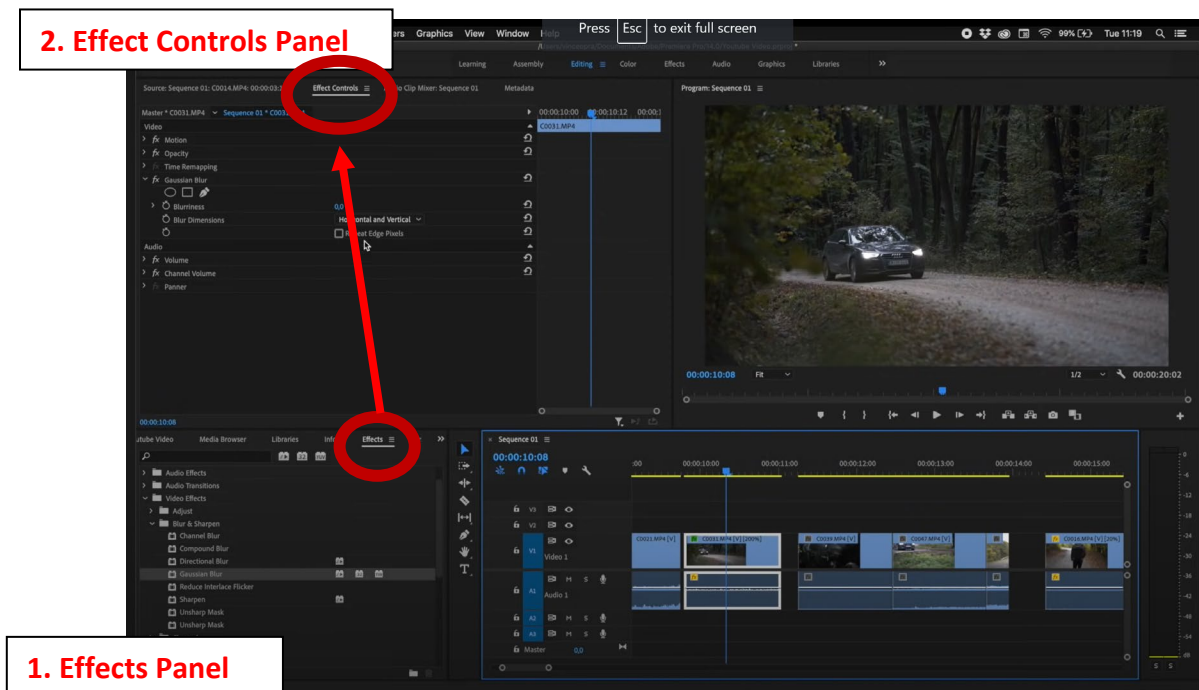
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In the “Effect Controls” panel, you can control parameters of elements numerically (e.g., scale, position, opacity, rotation). For example:

1. Select a video clip on your timeline.
2. Open the “Effect Controls” panel (**Window > Effect Controls**). This window will appear upper left.
3. Change the “Scale” of the clip from 100% to a larger or smaller percentage by typing in the new number or clicking on the left or right arrow.

Notice you can also access this panel through a tab at the top of the panel.

Other panels can change function, as well, through the tabs at the top of the panels. For example, some people like to change their Project Panel into an Effects panel (for transitions, etc.) by clicking the “Effects” Tab in the lower left panel. Then they open the Effect Controls Panel in the upper left.

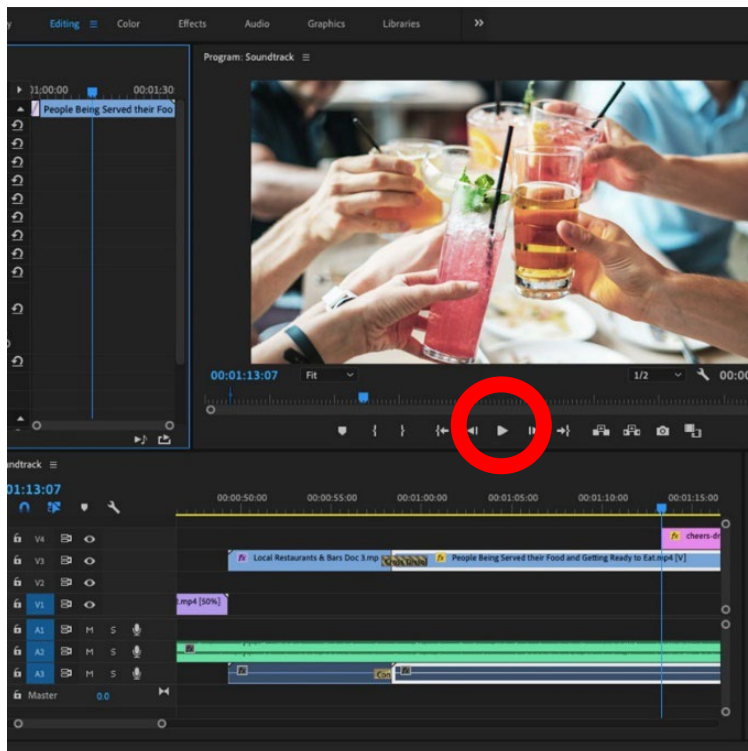

# Get Around

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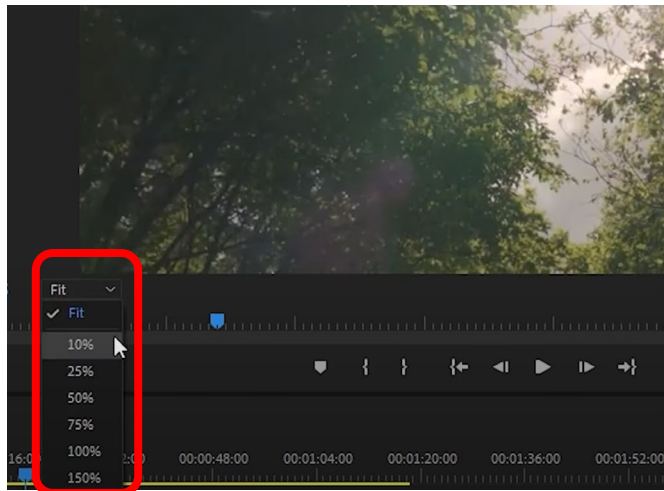
## ■ **PLAY YOUR VIDEO ON THE TIMELINE**

Click the “Play” button in the Program Panel where your video appears (upper right). This is where you will play your video to see how it looks as you create it.

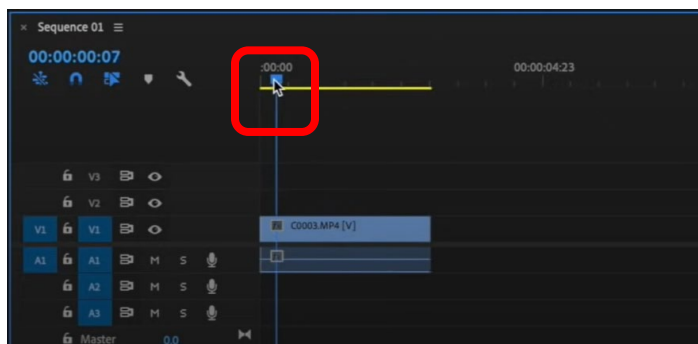


## ■ HOW TO ZOOM & MOVE

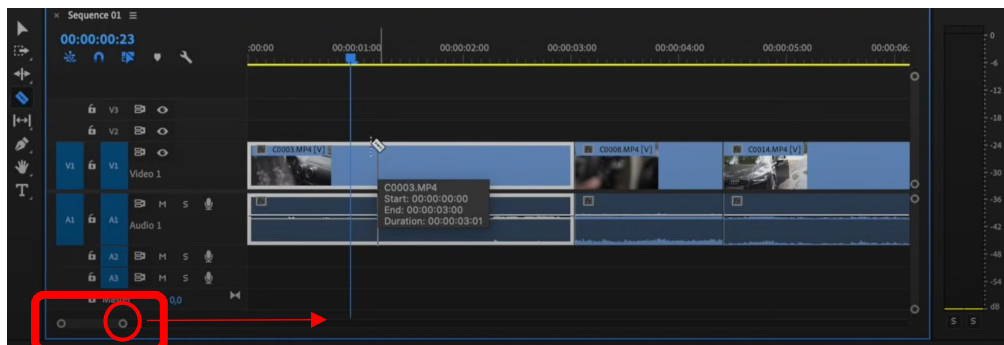
### Zoom In/Out of Video Preview



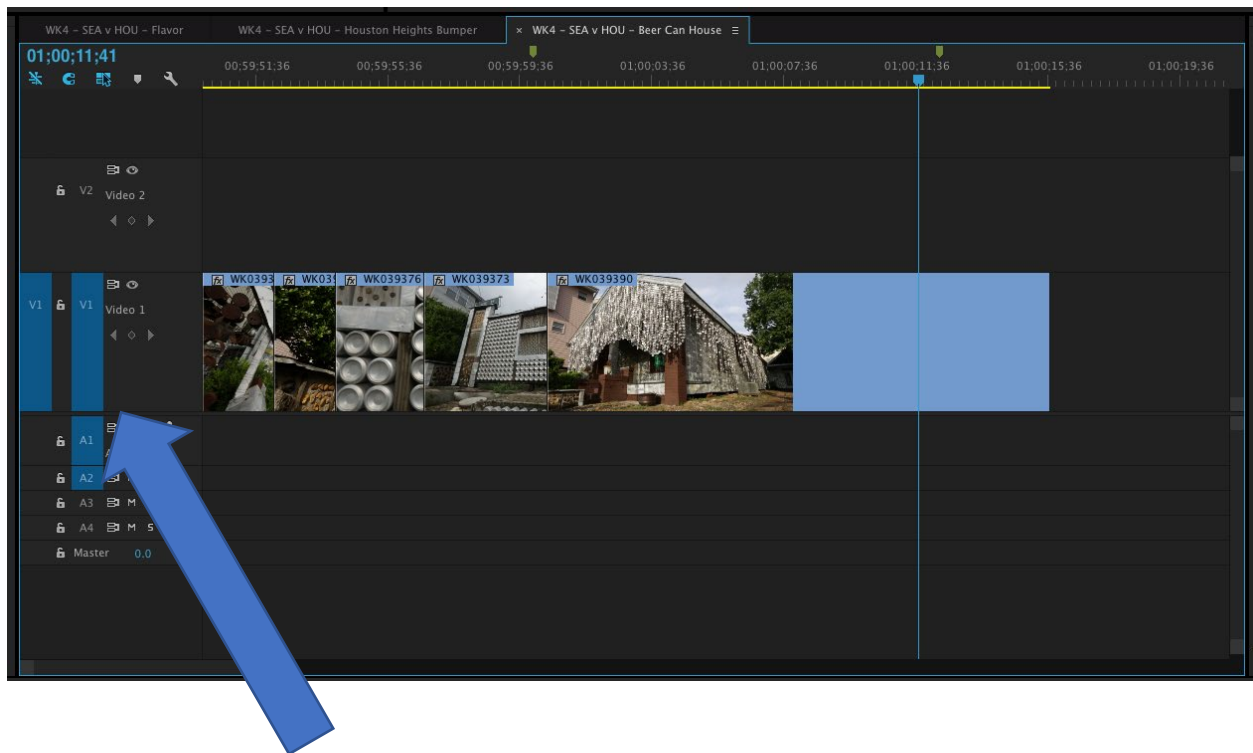
**Move Your Playhead on the Timeline.** Click on the top of the playhead (the blue vertical line). Drag it through the timeline, or click a new spot on the top of the timeline to make it jump there.



**Zoom in/out of Timeline.** Use the slider at the bottom of the timeline or use Opt/Alt and your track pad. Click and drag the right circle to make the timeline larger or smaller. Click and drag the whole slider to move through your timeline.

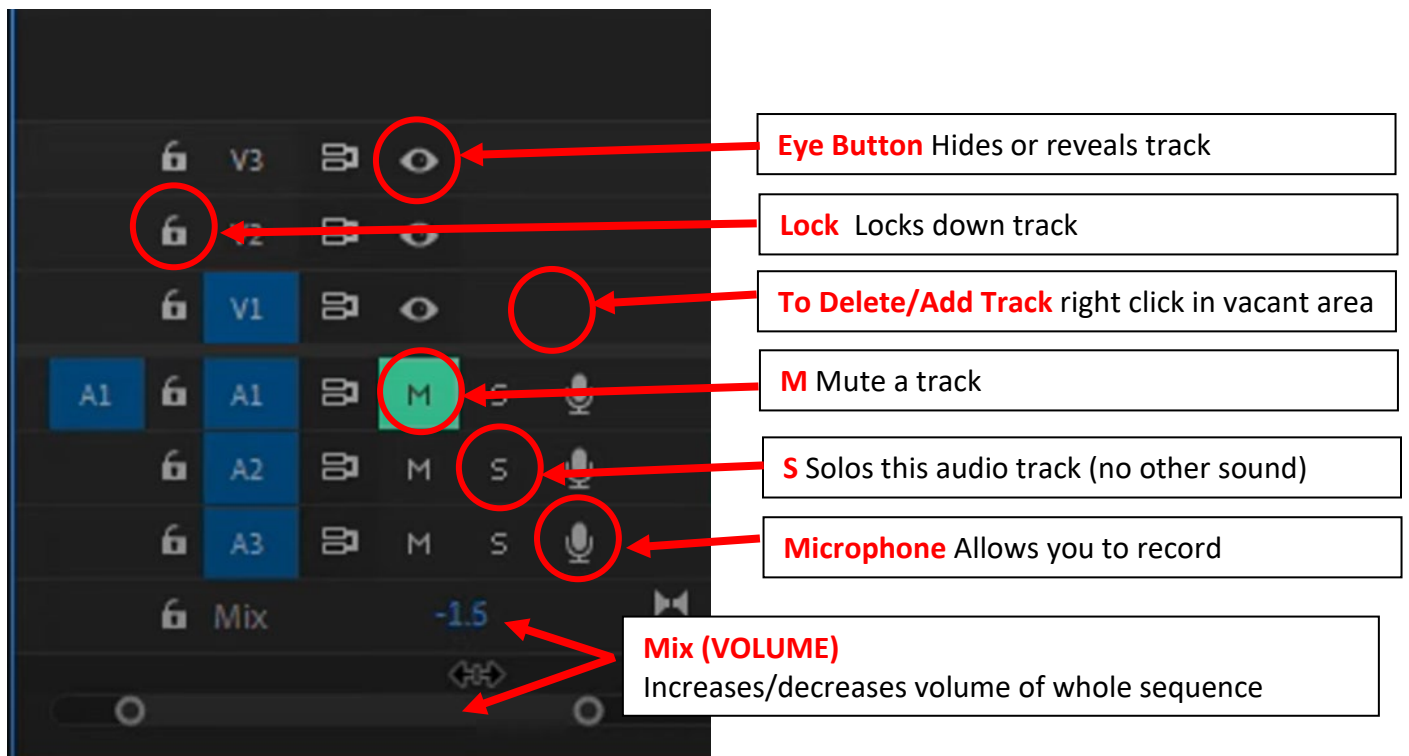


**Enlarge Timeline View.** Select the **bottom line** of a track and **drag it down or up**. You will see images on your timeline get larger or smaller.

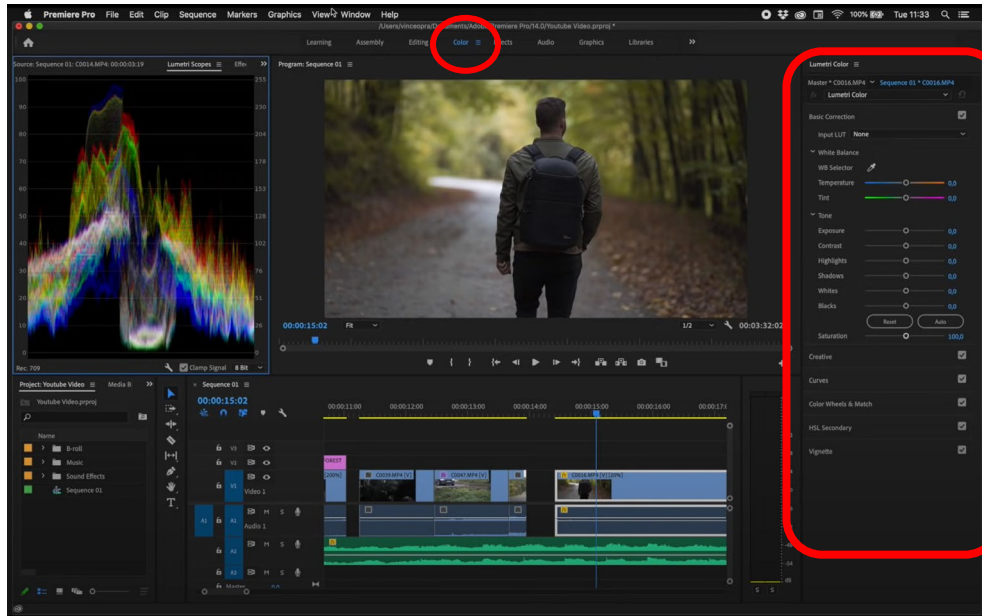
# Color Corrections

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## CORRECT COLOR/LIGHTING

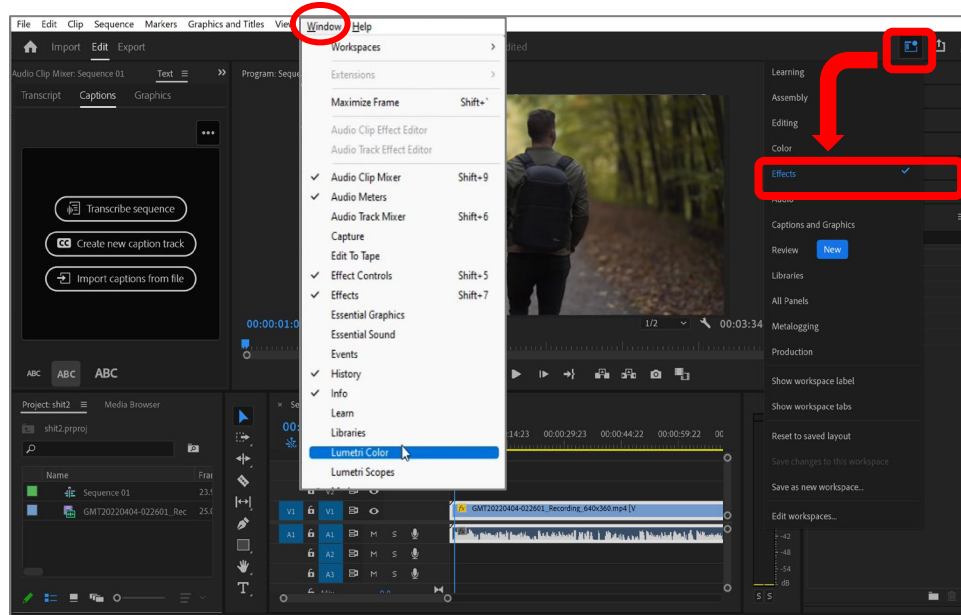
It's a good idea to make color corrections on a clip **before you cut** it and start editing.

1. If you have a top menu option for **"Color"** select it, and you will see the **color effects controls open in a panel on the right**. Change the settings as needed.
2. However, if you have the updated version, see the second screenshot.



For the new version, it's a little more complex:

1. Select the **Workspace** button (upper right)
2. Select **"Effects."** You will see an Effects panel open on the right.
3. Go to **Window > Lumetri Color** to see the settings like the ones in pic above.





## ■ ADVANCED: COLOR GRADING (Optional)

Color grading is shifting the colors of all segments in a video to set a mood or adopt consistency.

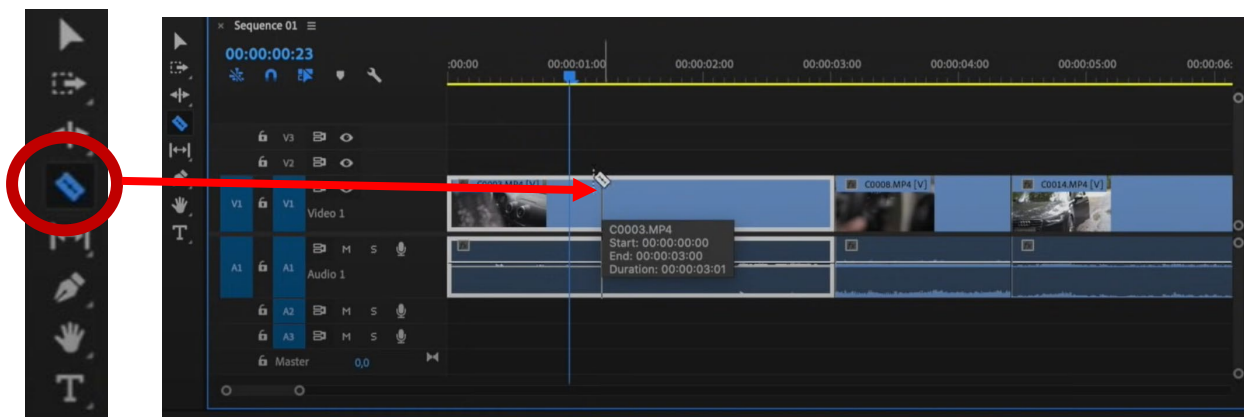

# Edit Clips

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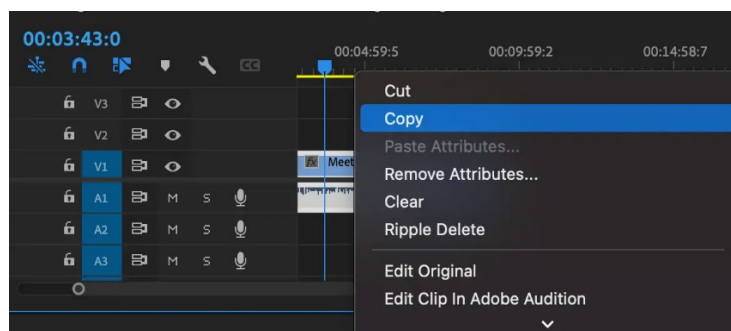
## ■ CUT / MOVE / DELETE CLIPS

1. Use the **razor tool** (or “C” on keyboard) to cut a clip into pieces on the timeline.
2. Use the selection tool to move clips on the timeline.
3. Use the “Delete” key to delete a selected clip.



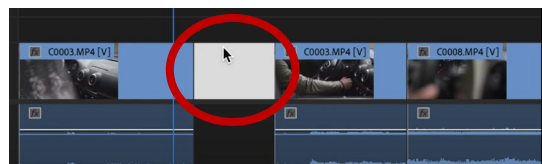
## ■ COPY / PASTE CLIPS

1. To **copy/paste**, select your clip and right-click for options or use Ctrl/Command-C and V.



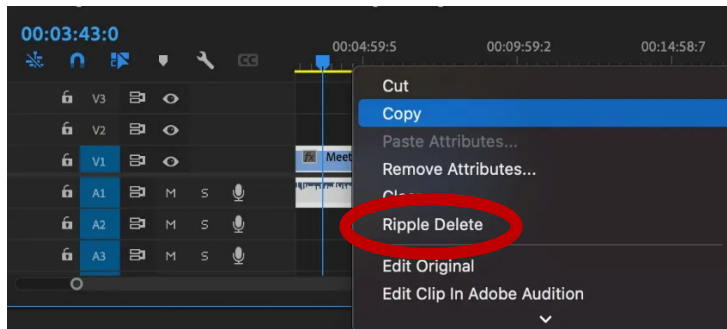
## ■ DELETE SPACE

To delete the empty space, click on the space and click the “Delete” key.



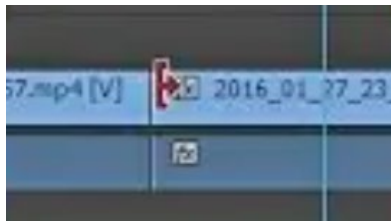
## RIPPLE DELETE (delete video clip and the gap left behind)

Ripple deleting will delete the element and also the gap it leaves behind on the timeline.



## SHORTEN A CLIP

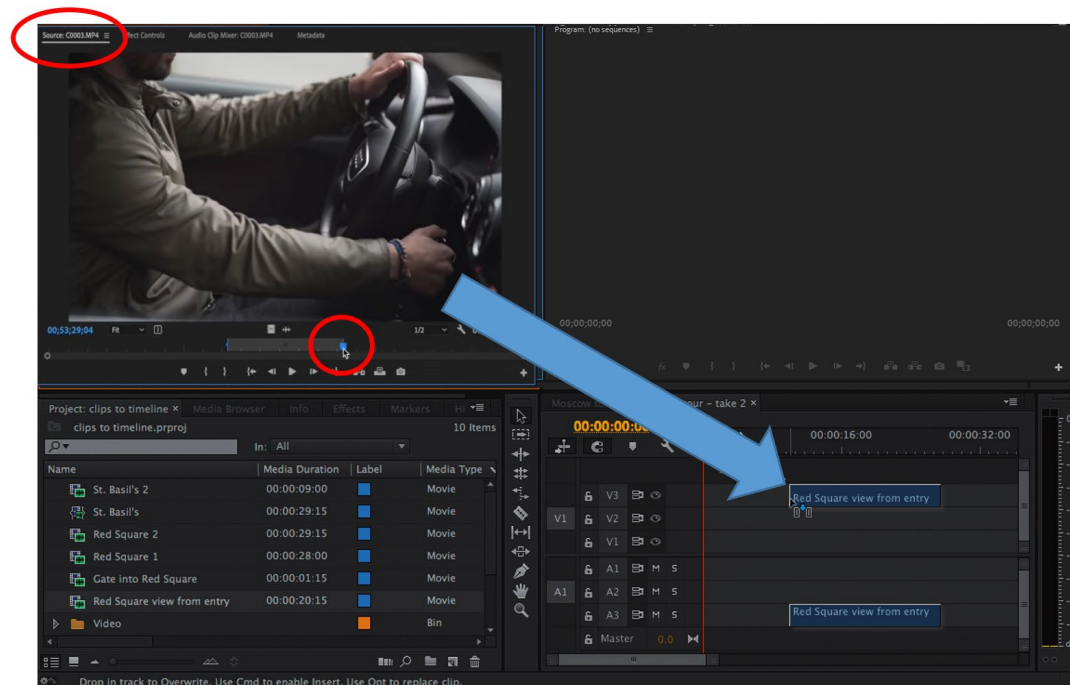
1. Select the clip you want to shorten.
2. Position your cursor over the end you want to shorten. Then, click and drag.



## OPTIONAL: PRE-EDIT A CLIP IN THE SOURCE PANEL

If you want to create shorter clips before placing them on the timeline:

1. In the Project Panel, select the "Media Browser" tab to see your bins/folders.
2. In the Source Panel (upper left) click the "Source" tab
3. To trim your clip, move the **playhead to your inpoint and click "I"** on the keyboard. Then move **playhead to out point and click "O."**
4. Then drag the clip from that panel to the timeline.

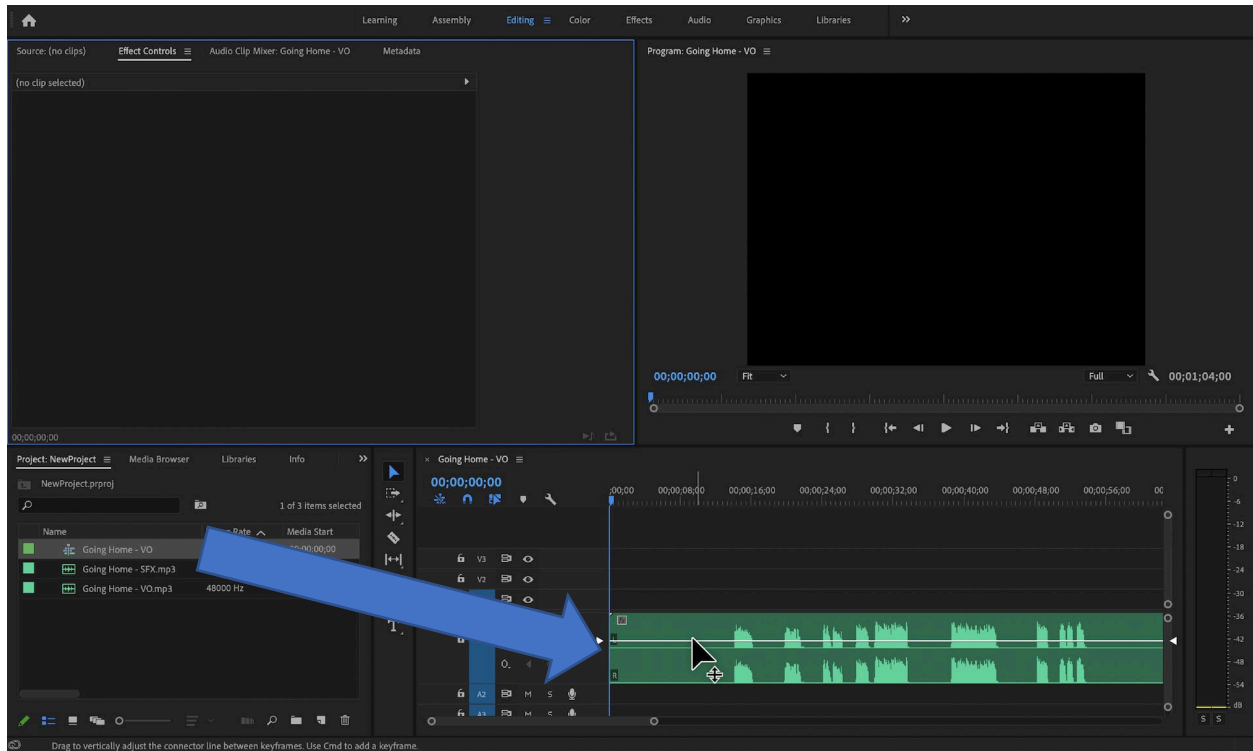


# Add Audio

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## ■ ADD AUDIO TO TIMELINE

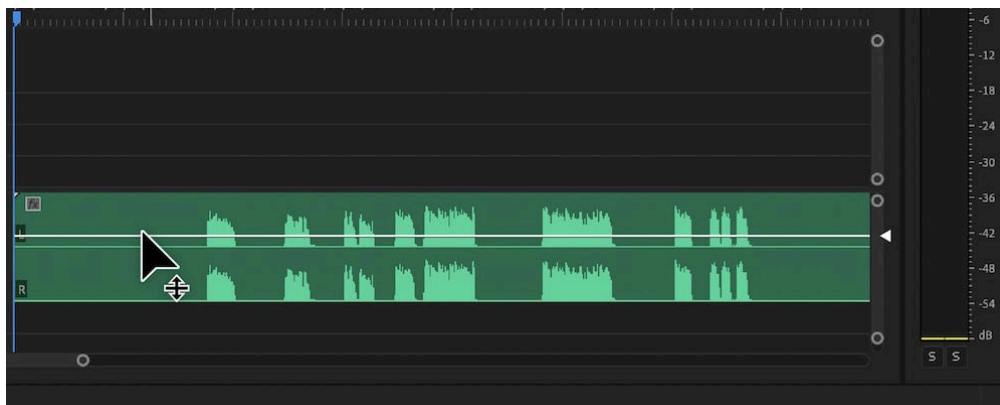
Drag your audio clip from the media bin (Project Panel) to the timeline, on an audio track.



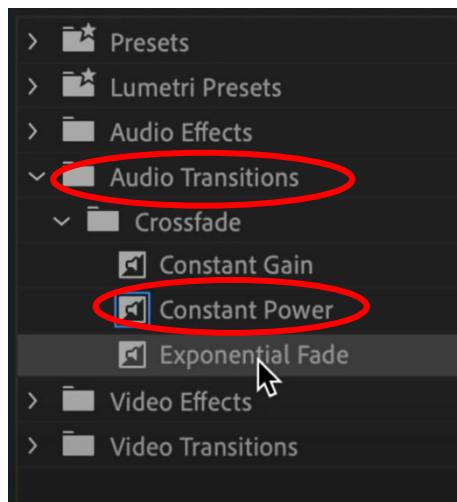
## ■ ADJUST THE VOLUME AS NEEDED

The easiest way to do this is to:

1. Expand the size of the audio clip (see [How to Increase Timeline View](#) on a previous page)
2. You will see a white horizontal line across your audio clip.
3. Drag it down to decrease volume or up to increase volume.



## FADE MUSIC IN AND OUT

- Go to Window > Effects
- Click on “Audio Transitions” and “Crossfade”
- Choose “Constant Power” if you want the smoothest fades
- Drag the effect onto the end of your audio track.
- Drag out the effect icon to make the fade as long or short as you like.
- To fade in, drag the effect to the start of the music and use the same methods to alter.

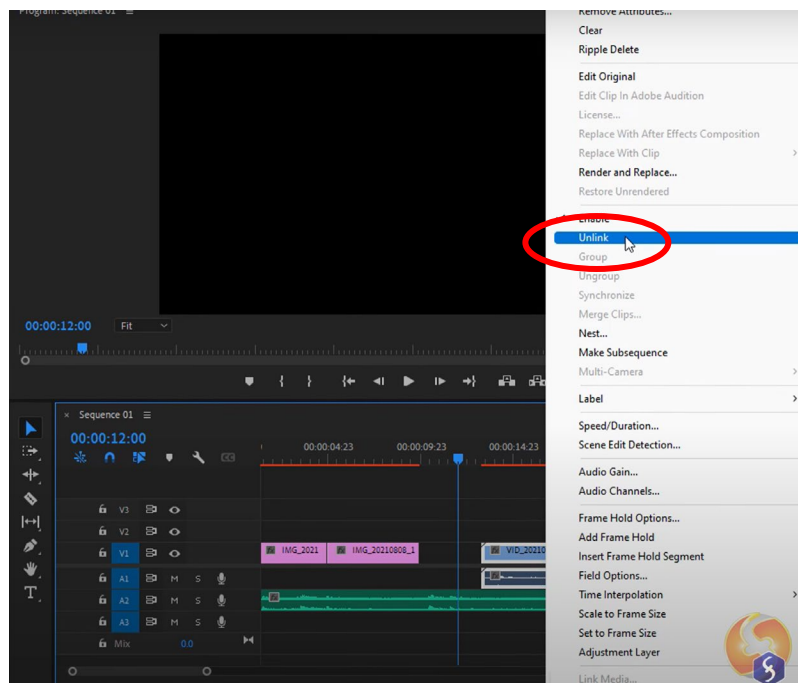

## UNLINK VIDEO & AUDIO (to delete one or the other on a clip)

By default, the audio of a video clip moves with the clip.

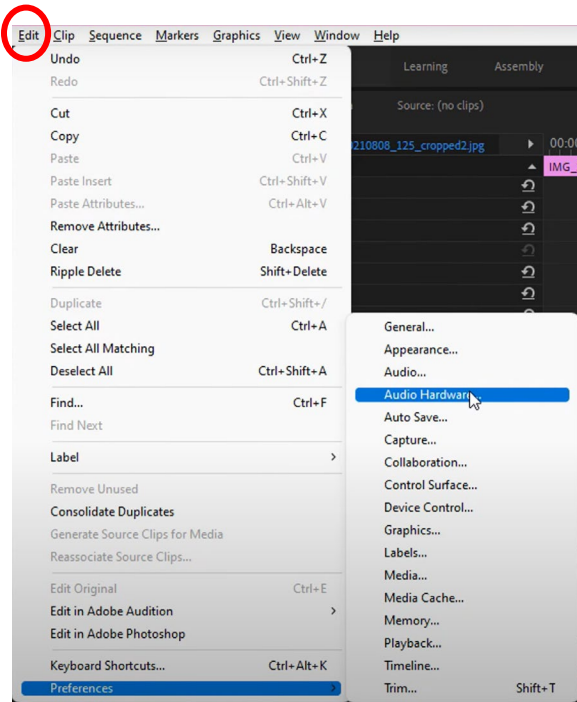
If you want to be able to edit audio and video separately, **right-click on the clip and select “unlink.”**

Now you can manipulate audio and video separately, or delete one or the other.



## CHANGE AUDIO SOURCES (external, internal, etc.)

Edit > Preferences > Audio Hardware



## Transitions & Effects

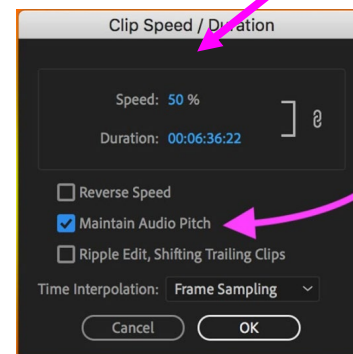
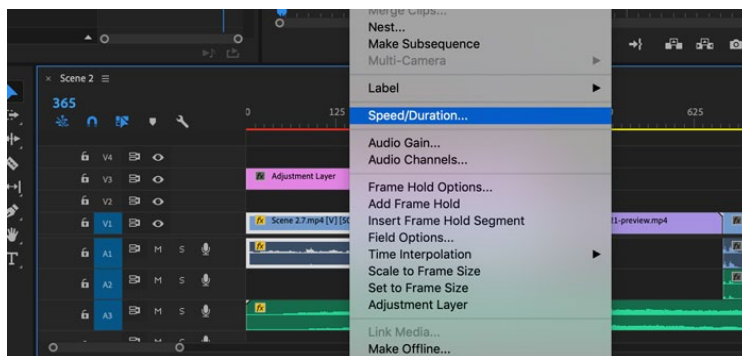
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### SLOW MOTION / FAST MOTION:

1. Right-click on the video clip and choose Speed/Duration.
2. You will see speed 100%.

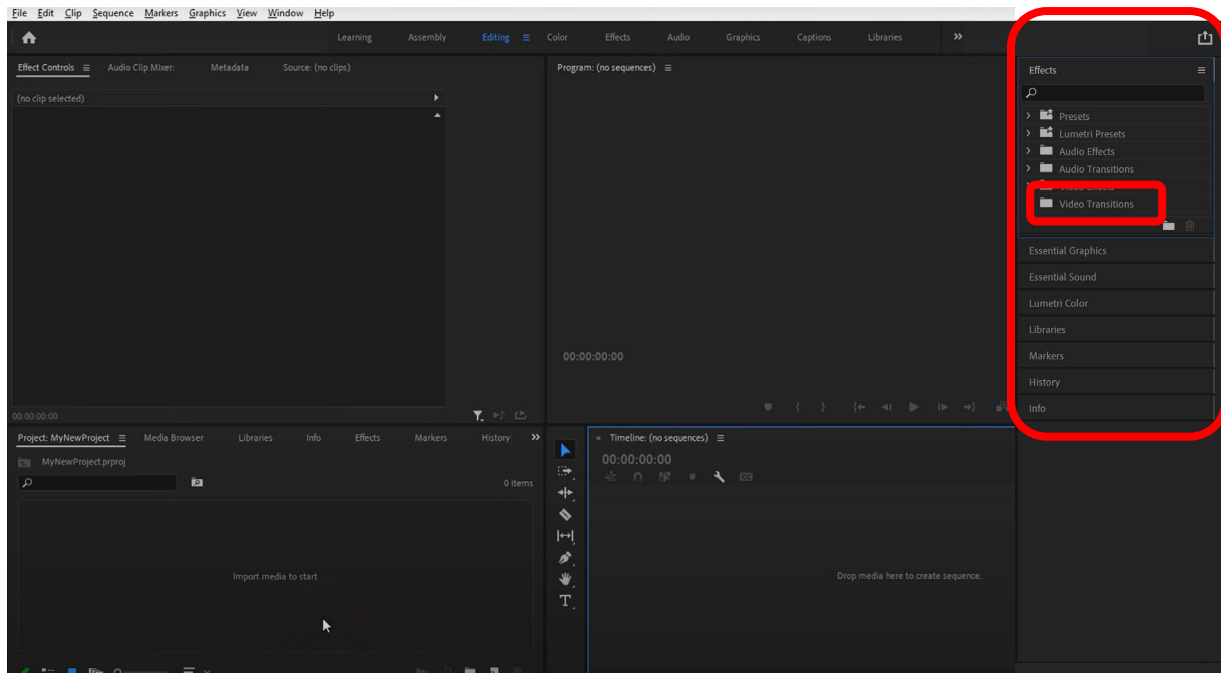
To slow down clip, decrease the percentage. To increase speed, increase the percentage

3. To keep audio/voices at normal pitch, click "Maintain Audio Pitch" (Optional).

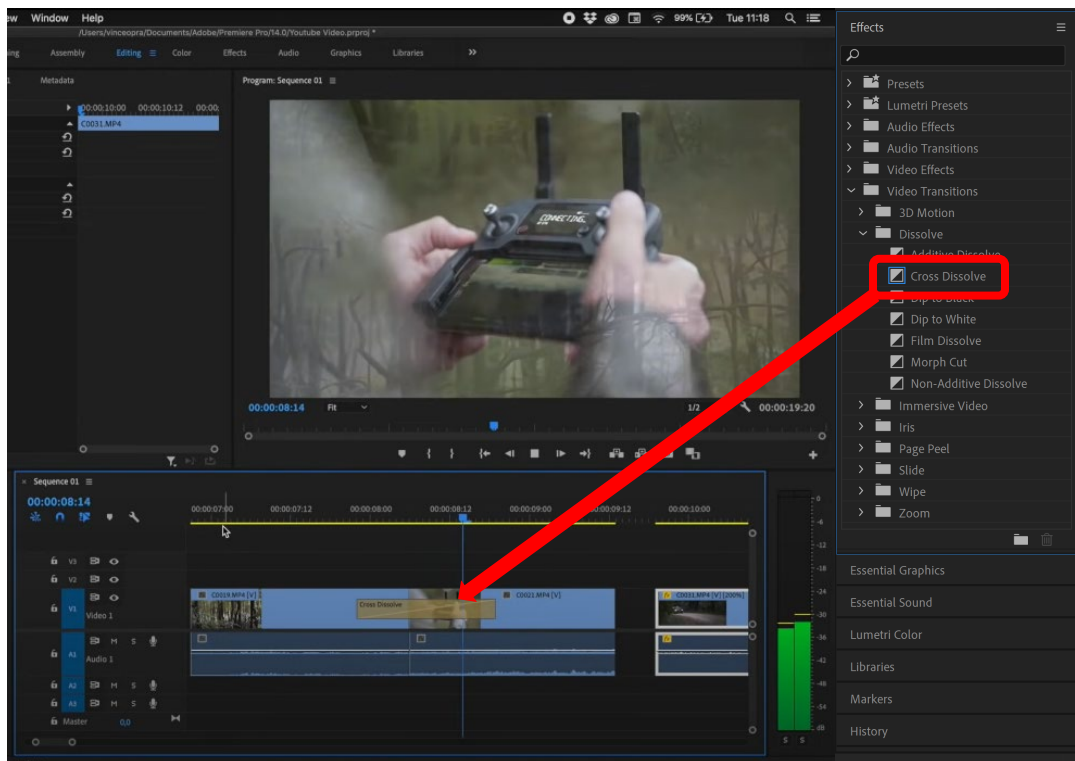


## TRANSITIONS

1. Open your Effects Panel (Windows > Effects).
2. Select **Video Transitions**.



3. You will see the transition choices open (see screenshot below).
4. Choose **"Cross Dissolve"** (a popular option) and drag it onto a single clip OR between two clips.
5. You will see the **brown effects bar** appear on the clip(s) in the timeline.
6. Play your video to see the transition effect.
7. To **adjust the length** of the dissolve, drag the brown bar on your clip in the timeline.



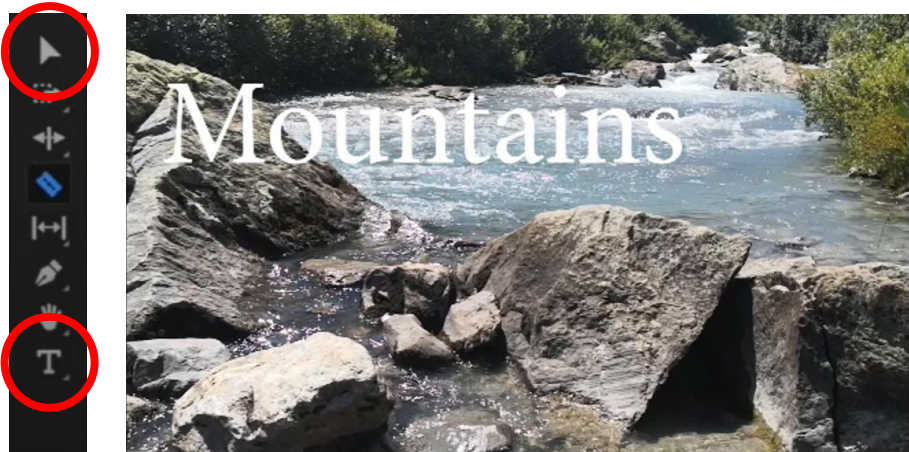


# Text Effects

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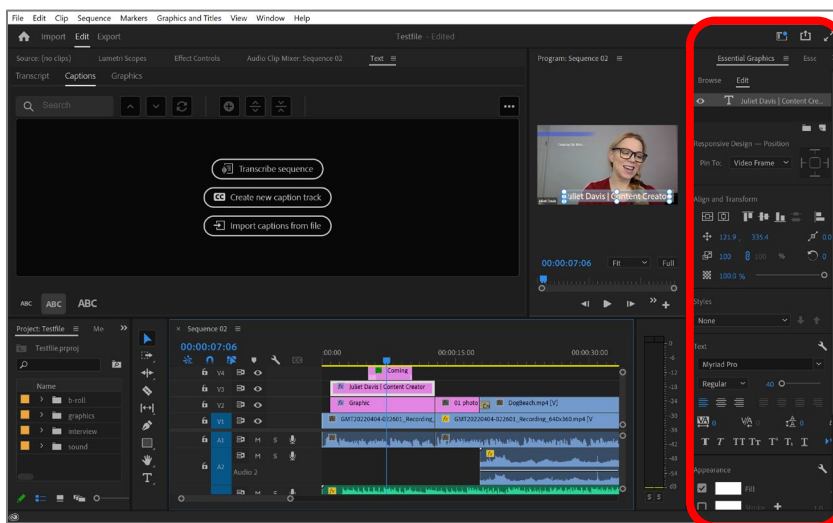
## TEXT TOOL

1. Choose the **text tool**
2. **Drag a textbox** on your video
3. **Type** the words you want.
4. Use **selection tool to move**, scale, and rotate text.



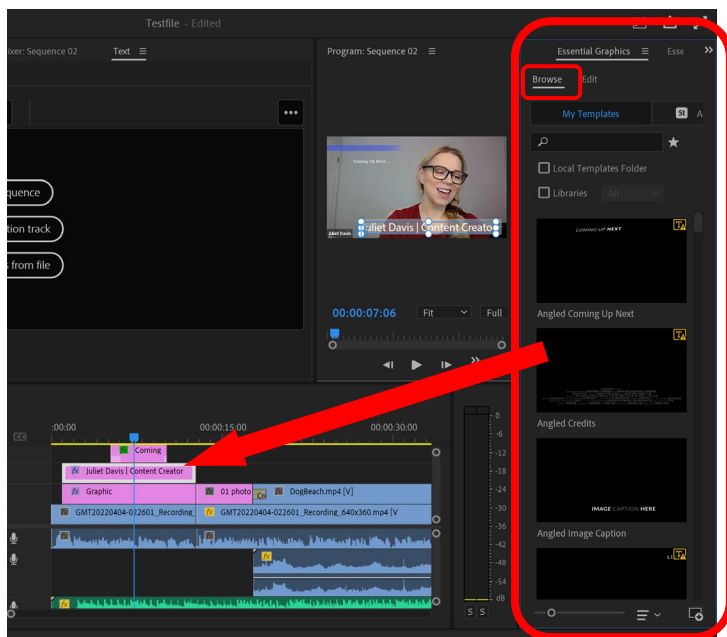
## TEXT EFFECTS:

1. With your **"Effects" Panel** still open on the right (Window > Effects), **select some text** on the video.
2. You should see the **"Essential Graphics"** effects controls open in the Effects Panel.  
If not, go to **Window > Essential Graphics**.
3. Adjust font, style, color, background, alignment, kerning, leading, tracking, etc.



## TEXT ANIMATION TEMPLATES

1. In the Essential Graphics Panel, click the **Browse** tab at the top.
2. **Choose** an animation or text effect and **drag it to the timeline**. The words will appear in pink clips.
3. To change the words in the animation, click the type on the video preview screen and edit.

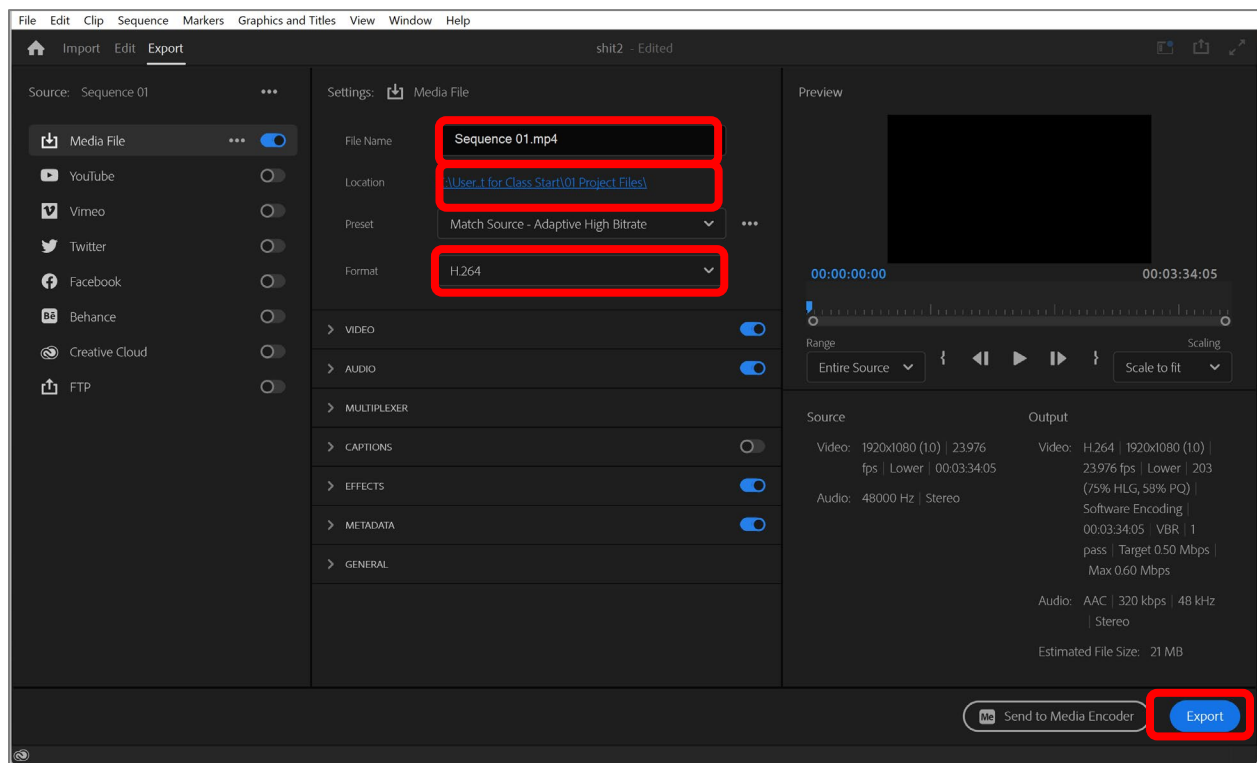


# Export Video

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## HOW TO EXPORT YOUR VIDEO

1. Go to **File > Export > Media**
2. **Name** the MP4 you're exporting.
3. Identify the **location** where you want the file saved
4. Keep defaults for the rest of settings  
(NOTE: H264 is the codec for mp4)
5. Click **"Export."** It can take time to render. This is normal.



# Troubleshooting

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## ■ MY COMPUTER FROZE UP / STOPPED WORKING RIGHT

Restart your computer. It's normal for your computer to slow down gradually and stop working when you use big programs like Premiere Pro. It means your RAM is running low (Random Access Memory). RAM refreshes when you restart your computer.

## ■ MY EXPORTED VIDEO HAS IMAGES BUT NO SOUND

These are known issues with recent versions of Premiere when used with iPhone footage. Most of the time, you should have no problem, but if you do, try this before you export:

1. Go to: File > Project Settings > General > Renderer
2. You will see the setting "GPU Exceleation." Change it to "Engine Software Only."
3. Try again to export and see if it works.

## ■ MY EXPORTED VIDEO IS OVEREXPOSED

1. Go to Sequence > Sequence Settings.
2. Click the box called "Auto Tone Map Media."

# Retouching

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## ■ EFFECTS CONTROL

1. Soften Pixels

Video Effects > Immersive Video > VR D-Noise

Effects Control: **D-Noise .05 or .08**

2. Glow

Video Effects > Immersive Video > Glow

Effects Control: **Glow Brightness .20**

## ■ LUMETRI COLOR

**Warmer: Temperature 3**
